The final day for Gr. 9 & 10 classes will be Friday, June 21. Teachers may have 9 & 10 students come in who are at-risk or need to follow-up on missed learning opportunities on June 24 & 25.

Gr. 9, 10 & 11 report card comments & marks are due on Friday, June 21. Report cards will be sent out the last week of school.

InformNet - Manitoba's Online High School - offers full-credit online courses for students within the school year and an **online summer session** from **July 2 - 29, 2024**, inclusive.

Summer session courses are open to all students in Manitoba. We offer:

- Repeater courses for students who have not successfully completed a course(s) during the regular academic year or wish to improve their passing grade.
- Non-repeater course full course options for grades 10 to 12. Note: Courses with provincial exams are not available to students yet to graduate.



FEES

- Repeater courses are \$250 per course.
- Non-repeater courses are \$500 per course.

Invoices are emailed from PayPal. You don't need a PayPal account to settle the invoice.

Summer Session Refund Policy

- Up to July 4, 2024 full refund available.
- July 5, 2024, and onwards no refund issued.

Please ensure that all course payments are completed by July 2, 2024. Note: Any unpaid invoices will be canceled after July 4, 2024, leading to the removal of students from their registered courses on July 5, 2024.

Due to time restrictions and the heavy workload associated with this level of course commitment, students can not register for more than 4 repeater classes or 2 non-repeater classes.

- Students who choose non-repeater courses should plan to allocate up to four hours per day, per course.
- Students who choose repeater courses (students need to have previously taken and completed the course and want to improve their mark) need to allocate two hours a day, per course.

THE DETAILS

InformNet Summer Session is Manitoba's only online summer session program.

- Summer session online registration opens May 1, 2024, at https://www.informnet.mb.ca/summer.html
- Summer session registration closes on July 4, 2024, or when capacity is reached.
- All online courses have a teacher who is available to the students on the weekdays.
- Students need access to a computer and the internet.
- Course materials are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week from July 2, 2024, to July 29, 2024, inclusive.
- All InformNet summer session courses close at 11:59 p.m. on July 29, 2024.




You can now see your student's marks on your phonel portage.powerschool.com

- Your Parent Portal account has already been set up for you.
 - You will need to create a password, though. To do this, open a web browser and navigate to portage.powerschool.com.
- Do not include www in front of the address
- Click on forgot username or password.
- You will now need to enter your email address in both the username and email address boxes.
 - Use the email address where you receive school emails
- Click the enter button.
- The system will email you a password reset link. It may take several minutes for you to receive the email.
 - Check your spam or junk folders if you've not received the email within 15 minutes.
 - The email link is only valid for 24 hours, so be sure to click the link and create your password within that time.
 - If the link expires, you can follow the same process again.

- Download the PowerSchool Mobile App.
- When you are prompted to add your district code
 - Click on "Where's my district code"
 - Choose "Enter Server Address" and then enter


